Our transformation into a School in 2022 reflects our growing scope, ambition, and leadership in policy education and research, at UConn and beyond.

IMRP JOINS THE SCHOOL

The Institute for Municipal and Regional Policy (IMRP) joined SPP in 2021 - underscoring a commitment to policy research in Connecticut and beyond, and our mission to serve public and nonprofit sectors.

SCHOOL GROWTH & CAPACITY

SPP's teaching and research capabilities have been enhanced by the expansion of faculty, including with the addition of the IMRP, positioning the School as a leader in teaching and research in Connecticut and beyond. SPP sustains initiatives through diverse funding streams.

FACULTY GROWTH The addition of six (6) faculty and three (3) research faculty from AY 22-23 to AY 24-25. The School employs 16 full-time faculty, and engages dozens of affiliated and part-time faculty.



RECENT IMPACT STORIES - RESEARCH

IMRP has had a long history of influencing criminal justice, sentencing other areas such as policing and cannabis equity policies in Connecticut. This past year, their work helped pass legislation prioritizing outpatient competency restoration for misdemeanor defendants (PA 24-137).

Dr. Eric Brunner recently conducted an evaluation of the Learner Engagement and Attendance Program (LEAP) in collaboration with the Center for Connecticut Education Research Collaboration (CCERC). Based in part on the positive findings from that evaluation, Governor Ned Lamont advocated to include the program in the state budget as a permanent line item.

Dr. Mohamad Alkadry's work on compensation equity done in collaboration with the CT Office of the State Comptroller led Gov. Lamont to issue Executive Order 24-2, Achieving Equity in Connecticut State Government, which among other things, established the Office of Equity and Opportunity within the Office of the Governor.

As the Director of Advancing Research, Methods, and Scholarship for Gun Injury Prevention (ARMS), Dr. Kerri Raissian has been asked to provide testimony to the Connecticut General Assembly, gone to the White House to meet with the Deputy Director of the Office of Gun Violence Prevention, and meets regularly with federal Congressional representatives about evidence-based gun policy.






STUDENTS & ACADEMICS


UNDERGRADUATE ACADEMIC PIPELINE








This fee-based program receives supplementary funding from **AARP** and is designed to support community members looking to transition careers from corporate backgrounds to nonprofit work.
